#### **Brain Injury Services Fund Program (BISF)** The Human Services Department (HSD) Brain Injury Services Fund Program is a state government program that assists individuals with TBI and other acquired brain injuries by providing short term case management and life skills training in crisis situations. This

program is designed to be short term and to last no more than a year.
