### **Disability Determination Services (DDS)**

DDS operates by agreement between the State of Tennessee and the Social Security Administration to process Social Security and Supplemental Security Income disability claims.

**Family Voices of Tennessee** a program of the Tennessee Disability Coalition that provides emotional and educational support to the families of children with special healthcare needs, chronic illnesses or disabilities.

**Nashville Disability Information** provides information and resources about and for those affected by disability.

**TBI Family Support Program** is funded by state dollars and designed to assist individuals with disability due to TBI and their families to remain together in their homes and communities.

**TennCare Medicaid** is the state of Tennessee's Medicaid program. It provides healthcare to mostly low-income pregnant women, parents or caretakers of a minor



child, children and individuals who are elderly or have a disability.

## The Crumley House Brain Injury

**Rehabilitation Center** has received a grant from the Tennessee Department of Health/ Traumatic Brain Injury Program to provide services to individuals and their family members. Service coordination is designed to bridge the gap in services to individuals with brain injuries, and service coordinators identify the needs of each individual and identifies appropriate resources within the community. Brain injury services coordination will assist in the following areas:

- Applying for Social Security Benefits
- TennCare and insurance issues
- Referral to appropriate housing
- Providing information and referral
- Evaluation and assessment of needs
- Development of a service plan to meet the identified needs
- Assistance in locating and accessing resources and services such as medical care, housing, counseling, transportation, rehabilitation, vocational training, and cognitive/ behavioral training
- Advocacy for brain injury survivors and their families
- Support group information
- Providing family education
